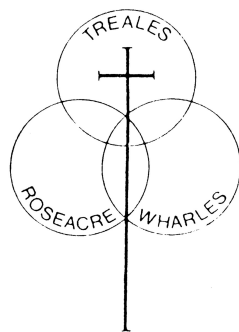

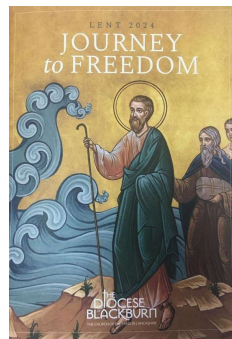

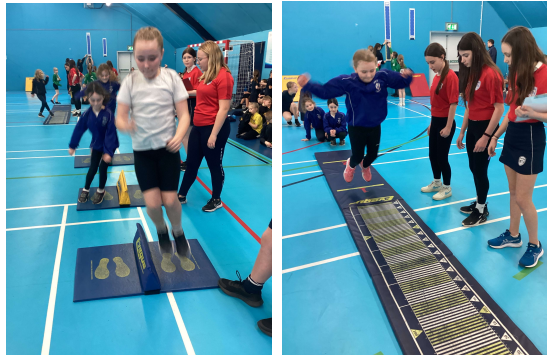

On Thursday we celebrated Thinking/Founders Day with our members of the Guiding and Scouting Association coming in uniform.

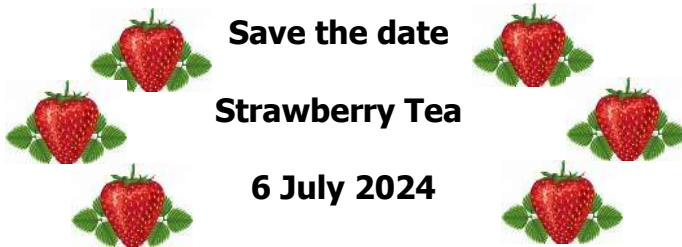

LETTER FOR MARCH

Dear Friends,

There are so many things going on this year in the month of March that I was spoiled for choice in selecting a topic about which to write to you. It finally boiled down to just one of two. Should it be National Peanut-Butter Lovers Day or Lent. Naturally, I initially chose the former, but on reflection, I thought I'd better settle for Lent.

The word Lent has its origins in the old English word for Spring - a time when the earth renews itself and the cycle of the seasons begins anew. So it is highly appropriate that the season of Lent occurs in the Spring because the church itself needs constant renewal and Lent is a time which calls us to turn away from our sins and renew our commitment to Christ.

During the temptation in the wilderness, Jesus fought and overcame the temptations of the devil and launched his attack on sin which was to culminate in his great victories of Good Friday and Easter Day. Lent therefore is a time when we too can face up to the sin in our lives and pray for forgiveness and the coming of The Kingdom. Our prayer 'Thy kingdom come' however must first be achieved in our own hearts before it can take root in the world.

Of course all seasons are proper times for repentance and humility of spirit, but Lent emphasises the need for honesty towards ourselves and towards God, and is a valuable period of self examination before the great rejoicing of the Easter festival.

The more perceptive amongst you will have noticed that I have not yet mentioned 'giving up' for Lent. The reason for this is simple; I don't believe that giving up something which you didn't need in the first place is either a sacrifice or evidence of ones commitment to God. What I would like to see is every Christian in the world adding something on for Lent. There are about 2.2 billion Christians on this planet and forty days (excluding Sundays) in Lent. Do the arithmetic - one good deed every day in Lent by every Christian = 88 billion extra acts of kindness or generosity. That would eclipse even the peanut butter lovers wouldn't it.

ROAD CLOSURE BLUE MOOR

A TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF THROUGH TRAFFIC ORDER

The prohibition will be operative from 0800 on Monday 8th April 2024 until 1800 hours on Friday 14th June 2024 or until completion of work within this period. Access will be maintained wherever possible. However motor vehicles WILL NOT be permitted across the bridge.

The temporary closure is necessary to allow the full deck refurbishment of Blue Moor Road Overbridge to be carried out by National Highways.
