

LETTER FOR MAY

Dear Friends,

During the month of May we shall be celebrating the ancient feast day of Pentecost. Many of you, like me, will have grown up knowing it as Whit Sunday. (So-called after the white robes worn by those newly baptised at Pentecost.) It was a day of religious processions - The Whit Walks - fairgrounds, and the day I got to wear my new Summer sandals for the first time each year.

Pentecost always comes on a Sunday. Unlike Christmas and Easter this day passes with such little fanfare that, unless you are a churchgoer, there is a good chance you will not even notice it.

You will probably know Pentecost as a celebration of the day when the Holy Spirit of God came down to the followers of Jesus. This is the day that the church, the "called-out ones" of God, was born. On that day, the Spirit of God descended on the 120 followers of Jesus and they started speaking out loud in languages from around the world. This created such a commotion that thousands who were in Jerusalem at the time came to see what was happening, and in front of the gathering crowd, Peter spoke the first gospel message and 'three thousand were added to their number that day'. That's a remarkable testimony to the power of the Holy Spirit. Twenty-five times as many people became followers of Jesus on that single day than had 'joined up' during his entire ministry on earth.

Pentecost is therefore a timely annual reminder to us that the Holy Spirit is not a lesser member of the Trinity, in some way inferior to the Father and the Son, but is the powerful manifestation of God's presence amongst us. The Holy Spirit, leads, teaches, informs and empowers us, so let us thank God that consumerism and the retail trade has not kidnapped this sacred and important day in the way it has with Christmas and Easter, and let us rejoice in the power of God made manifest within us.

MOORSIDE - cable renewal by Electricity NW closed until 17th May 2024.


ROSEACRE ROAD - pole replacement by BT Openreach closed 30th April 2024.

PARISH FIELD



This is a preview of the posters:



















A grant from Fylde Borough Council has been applied for and funds received which will cover the cost of both the signs and much needed new gate.

SOW AND GROW GROUP

Spring is here and the Parish is starting to burst with life and colour! The crocus, tulips, snakes head fritillaries and miniature daffodil bulbs planted last winter have looked amazing and have complemented the snowdrops, celandines, daffodils, bluebells, that are springing up everywhere often earlier than expected. They should naturalise well in the grass and increase year on year.

We would really like to increase snowdrops and bluebells (just the English ones please) throughout the Parish. If you have any you can spare and donate to the Parish please contact Jane asap as they are most successful if replanted "in the green" with leaves still on.

We have 8 new trees in the Parish thanks to Fylde Council; these are a mix of Copper Beech, Mountain Ash, Accers Autumn Blaze and Himalayan Birch and will provide beautiful colour in the a8utumn. Thanks to Will Salisbury for planting them.

Several of you have been growing perennials from seed and we hope to have summer colour in the grass verges and open spaces. Again we have opted for sustainability and wild flowers such as oxeye daisies, musk mallow, aquilegia, foxgloves as well as cornflowers and poppies. Would you please let Jane know how you have got on with your seedlings.

We are also experimenting with wild flower sowing and hope to replace the bedding plants in the centre of Treales with a wild flower border.

The Parish Council won't be cutting the grass of the open spaces until early June to allow the bulbs to thrive and we would encourage everyone to resist getting the mower out too soon or at least leaving strips of grass unmown to encourage our wonderful wildlife to flourish.

Thank you to everyone who as helped with planting bulbs and sowing seeds and litter picking, the Parish is looking really lovely. The move to sustainable, affordable planting and the re-wilding of of the Parish open spaces is still in its early stages and is a lot of trial and error. It will be a couple of years before we will have all the open spaces planted with perennials that have colour and interest throughout the seasons.

We would really welcome help and advice and suggestions from you all on how we can best achieve this.
