



LETTER FOR SEPTEMBER

Dear Friends,

September already. Where did the Summer go? (Some might say, did it ever came?)

The month of September gets its name from the Latin for seven, which might seem strange to you as it is in fact the ninth month. The reason for this anomaly is that it was the seventh month in the old Roman calendar until two more months (January and February) were added later, but it kept its old name.

On 2nd September 1752 the British Empire adopted the Gregorian calendar, and to bring everything into line from the old Julian calendar (which had been in use until then) the next day became September 14th. So, had we been around in those days, we would have aged by twelve days overnight.

As we get towards the harvest season, I am reminded of just how arbitrary were dates and times to our ancestors. They, like the farmers and growers of today, were interested only in the seasons and whether it was light enough to get up and start work or too dark to see much and therefore time to go to bed; and it was only with the advent of a national railway system with its timetable that the many and various time zones in the UK were brought into line. So for the first time in our history, when it was 12 o'clock anywhere in the country, it was 12 o'clock everywhere else too.

Time is an invention of human beings not of God. That wonderful hymn 'O God our help in ages past' includes the words 'A thousand ages in Thy sight are but a moment gone', and that is so true isn't it. We think in terms of hours, days and years whilst God is the God of eternity. It is worth reminding ourselves of that on a regular basis especially in this age of 'everything now'. God is working his purpose out, but in his time frame not ours. We may perhaps be tempted to despair when we see the chaos and hatred which so often bubbles to the surface of our society and think that the message of the gospels is not making any progress - but it is, slowly and inexorably. In the final analysis, it wasn't the riot shields and batons of our dedicated police force which brought an end to the August riots and thuggery, but the peaceful counter demonstrations by those who were not prepared to let the bigots and hooligans set the agenda and rule our streets.

If that isn't evidence of God at work, I don't know what is. Love and blessings,
